They are known for their vibrant energy, warmth and exciting choice of dances and music. Cristian danced with different folk dance ensembles in his native Romania. He received his certificate as a recognized solo dancer and choreographer in the field of folklore from the Romanian Ministry of Culture. In 1993, he joined Les Sortilèges, the oldest professional folk dance company in Canada, based in Montreal. Sonia was born in Québec. She was lead dancer, choreographer and artistic director, among other roles, for Les Sortilèges. It was there that the two met and formed a professional and personal partnership. They studied and worked with various specialists, including Ahmet Lüleci, Yves Moreau, Zeljko Jergan and Theodor Vasilescu. They have taught at l'École Supérieure de Danse du Québec, and have been part of the Artists in Schools program sponsored by the Québec Ministry of Education. As guest teachers at workshops in many different countries, they are known for their joyful yet rigorous teaching, and their delight in welcoming participants of all levels of



experience and ability. They discuss the origins of the dances, demonstrate them and break them down into small segments for participants to learn more easily. They always come to workshops with carefully prepared material, including CDs, DVDs and meticulous dance descriptions. Workshop organizers constantly ask Sonia and Cristian to come again for, without fail, the atmosphere is filled with smiles and laughter, beautiful dances and music.
