Ira Weisburd is an award winning, internationally recognized choreographer, creating dances for recreational Folk and Line Dancers for more than 40 years. His unique and diverse background comes from many years of researching the dance styles in countries around the world. It has enabled him to create a wide variety of circle and line dances, many of which have become instant classics, on the must do playlists of hundreds of groups.

He made his mark on the world of Israeli folk dancing with BOI MALKA back in 1985. Since then he has created dances with legendary choreographers from ISRAEL including Yoav Ashriel (Hassapico Sympatico), Gadi Bitton (Touch the Floor) and Eli Ronen (Hassapico Mo-zart). Ira was the first non-Israeli



to be recognized as an Israeli Folk Dance Choreographer. His dance SHUJ SHUJ ZEMER took 6th place out of more than 200 dances in the RIKUD HASHANA (2005 Dance of the Year Competition). His dance SONATA took 1st place in the same competition the following year. Ira has also taught at several major Folk & Line Dance Events including the Annual San Antonio Folk Dance Festival, Hora Shalom Israeli Dance Camp in Perth, Western Australia, Annual Hess Kramer Folk Dance Weekend in Malibu, Ca., and the Annual Dance Away Folk Dance Weekend (Netherlands),

Ira enjoys a Youtube and Facebook following of over 13,000 subscribers. He continues to give workshops in cities across the U.S., Canada, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Australia, New Zealand, Netherlands, Poland, Belgium, Germany, France, Reunion Island, Mauritius and Bulgaria. 
